



COVID-19 RE-ENTRY PLAN and FAQs

We are dedicated to providing a safe and healthy environment for our families and teachers. This document outlines the procedures we have in place to limit the risk of illness transmission in our school.

Increased Precautions - As students and families return, we will continue to have increased health precautions in all areas of our building.

Drop-off and Pick-up Procedures

Parents are not allowed to enter the building during drop-off and pick-up. There is a health check station in the front lobby. We are taking everyone's temperature and asking questions about their recent health. Students are required to wash hands immediately upon arrival.

Daily Health Considerations

We wash hands often with soap and water. We also clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces. We ask everyone to cover their coughs and sneezes (in your elbow). Personal protective equipment (PPE) is recommended by the CDC during daily temperature checks and when social distancing cannot be implemented. You may see our door greeters wearing PPE when you come to drop-off or pick-up. We're not requiring our team nor our students to wear masks at this time. We will continue checking students for illness symptoms during the day (temperature checks), continue hand washing routines and limit the sharing of materials among groups of students.

Materials and Building Cleanliness

Our classroom materials are cleaned throughout the day. We have a three step process that includes a sanitizing solution approved by the public health department. This includes toys, cribs, cots, bedding, and surface areas like tables, cabinet doors, mouthed objects, toileting areas, etc. In addition, we have a cleaning company that comes in daily to clean the building and sanitize bathrooms and floors.

What if someone becomes sick?

Our current health policy will continue to be in place. If a student becomes sick while at LLW, we will keep them separate from well children and contact their parent for immediate pick-up. Our health standard of students and teachers being free of contagious symptoms for 24 hours before returning will always be followed. If a child or teacher has symptoms that resemble COVID-19, we may require documentation of testing or require the recommended days of home isolation per the St. Charles County Public Health Department before returning to LLW. We have guidance that outlines how we need to respond if someone becomes ill.

Travel Policy - We ask that if you are planning on travelling outside of the St. Louis area, please share with us your plans and possible exposure to illness. We would talk through these questions and try to determine what the risk level would be: Are you driving or flying? Will you be going to many public places and/or restaurants when you're out of town? Are you meeting other family / friends from another part of the country? If we feel that your illness exposure risk is high, we may ask you to wait on your travel plans, or quarantine when you return.
